Moving Day - Monday 2 December – Minimal Supervision Available

Monday 2 December is our proposed moving day which will involve relocating 24 classrooms, furniture and storerooms full of teaching resources. On this day, students will not have access to teaching and learning as usual, supervision will be available on the day but it will be minimal. If you can, I encourage you to please keep students home on this day. If you need to send them to school, please note that only minimal supervision will be available. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

Moving Organisation

The following classes will be moving into the new building as of Monday 2 December

and will stay there until the end of the year - 6H, 6W, 6C, 3/4S, 2T, 1S and 1C. Students in these classes will assemble in our main COLA area on Tuesday morning and be taken to the new building by their teacher. Year 6 will be on a Transition Day at the high school, so their first day in the new building will be Wednesday.

Unless otherwise instructed, students whose class is moving to another room, will meet in the main COLA area when the bell goes at 9.20am on Tuesday 3 December. KP, KD, KS, 3M & 3W are not changing rooms. These teachers will be assisting other teachers with their move on Monday 2 December. The remaining 21 classes, along with the music room, computer lab and band room are all being relocated. This has required a massive level of organisation. Some classes might be moved at the end of the week, to accommodate a spread in the work load of our General Assistant, Jeff.

Furniture Giveaway – Monday 2 December

The school doesn't have appropriate storage space to house excess furniture and we will have guite a bit of excess furniture. Instrumental Program

Our school, in partnership with the Northern Rivers Conservatorium of Music runs a highly successful Instrumental Program. The program provides individual tuition and an avenue for performance with our Band or String Ensemble for students in Years 3 - 6. Tuition is available for: Flute, Clarinet, Trumpet, Trombone, Saxophone, Percussion and Bass Guitar. The students are provided with weekly half hour lessons from expert tutors. In addition, students are expected to participate in a weekly Band or String Ensemble rehearsal. To give you a glimpse of what the Instrumental Program entails, we extend a special invitation to you and your child to our Annual Band and Strings Recital to be held on Wednesday 4 December at 6.30pm at the Byron Bay Community Theatre.

Scholarships are available and we encourage you to apply in writing applications close on Friday 6 December.

P&C Full Cello Scholarship: The scholarship covers fees for one year of individual tuition, weekly band sessions and instrument hire.

Two half P&C Scholarships: One for flute and one for Clarinet - These scholarships cover fees for six months of individual tuition, weekly band sessions and instrument hire.
