Year 6 Canberra Excursion

Students from our school have undertaken an educational tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of \$60 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

Last Monday 25 November, Year 6 travelled south to Canberra for their final school camp. We settled in at the AIS for our stay. The food they catered was great and the dorm rooms were very nice. This experience was a blast, as we began with a tour of Old Parliament House and a visit to Questacon. The second day was equally as enjoyable, as we visited the Australian War Memorial and the current Parliament House. At the War Memorial, our captains contributed to a wreath laying ceremony for a specific war veteran. While we were at Parliament House, we had a tour through both the House of Representatives and the senate, which at the time were both in session. Overall the trip was a success and we are sure all the Year 6 students loved it! We would like to thank the teachers for the extra hours and the hard work they put in to make our excursion so great. Instrumental Program

Our school, in partnership with the Northern Rivers Conservatorium of Music, runs a highly successful Instrumental Program. The program provides individual tuition and an avenue for performance with our Band or String Ensemble for students in Years 3 - 6. Tuition is available for: flute, clarinet, trumpet, trombone, saxophone, percussion and bass guitar. The students are provided with weekly half hour lessons from expert tutors. In addition, students are expected to participate in a weekly Band or String Ensemble rehearsal. To give you a glimpse of what the Instrumental Program entails, we extend a special invitation to you and your child to our Annual Band and Strings Recital to be held tonight at 6.30pm at the Byron Bay Community Theatre.

Scholarships are available and we encourage you to apply in writing - applications close on Friday 6 December.

P&C Full Cello Scholarship: The scholarship covers fees for one year of individual tuition, weekly band sessions and instrument hire.

Two Half P&C Scholarships: One for flute and one for clarinet: These scholarships cover fees for six months of individual tuition, weekly band sessions and instrument hire.
