

#### **Remembrance Day**

Remembrance Day is commemorated on 11 November each year, marking the anniversary of the armistice which ended the First World War (1914–1918). It is held in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts. On Thursday, we marked the occasion with a special Remembrance Day Ceremony for our students which was telecast live to each classroom via Zoom. We laid wreaths, read poetry, listened to the Last Post and the Reveille, observed a minute's silence and spoke about why Remembrance Day is important to us. Thank you to Miss Buntz and staff for organising the ceremony and to the students who did a fantastic job leading the assembly.

#### **Captains Election Speeches**

Congratulations to each of the students who gave their Captains election speech, they all did a fabulous job and have much to be proud of.

Successful School Captains and Vice Captains will be announced at Presentation Day on Wednesday 8 December. We look forward to working with them in their new leadership roles in 2022. Well done and keep up the good work.

#### Permission to Publish

Last week, our new Permission to Publish note was sent home for your attention. Please make sure you read it carefully, tick the appropriate box and return the permission slip to school. Students whose parents do not give permission to publish will not appear in

the newsletter or on any social media accounts.

#### **Revised Enrolment Policy**

The revised 'Enrolment of Students in NSW Government Schools Policy', came into effect in term 4 2019. We now have a centrally set enrolment cap, which we have not reached. We also have a set local enrolment buffer to ensure places remain for our local, in zone enrolments. There is closer monitoring of non-local enrolments (out of zone enrolment applications) by the NSW Department of Education. Where possible non-local sibling enrolments will be prioritised. In the future, if school numbers increase and we exceed our set enrolment cap or local enrolment buffer level, which means that the school is at full capacity, then non-local enrolment applications will be asked to complete a 100-point residential address check to confirm that they live in zone. If your child/children have been enrolled at our school through the out of zone application process or you have moved out of our intake area, and you have a younger child entering Kindergarten in 2022, then you will need to fill in an out of zone application if you are not currently residing in our schools intake zone.

#### Planning for 2022

We have commenced our planning and organisation for 2022. If you know that your child/ children won't be attending our school in 2022, with the exception of Year 6 students, could you please inform the office. Similarly, if you are aware of any students moving into our area who will be attending our school in 2022, please ask the families to make contact with the school. We need this information to form classes for next year. Also, if you are having an extended holiday and your child/children will not be back at school on the first day of 2022, please let us know in writing, before the end of the year.

#### **Level 3 Restrictions**

As of Monday 8 November, all staff and adult visitors must be fully

vaccinated and provide proof of vaccination before entry on site is permitted. We are asking parents to not enter school grounds and to kiss and drop the children off outside the school gate. The same applies at pick up time. We are still operating under level 3 restrictions which means that parents are not allowed on site, with the exception of canteen volunteers and parents purchasing school uniforms.

Please practice social distancing when dropping off and collecting children. I will let you know when parents are allowed back on site. Please stay in contact with our school via phone calls and emails during this time. We look forward to the day when our school is open to all members of our school community, including our wonderful parents. We miss you and hope all is well with the family.


