E-Safety Regarding Photos and Videos Taken by Others

The <u>e-Safety Commission</u> provides online safety information for parents, grandparents and carers. There is also relevant legal information regarding photos and videos which are kept on mobile phones. <u>Youth Law Australia</u> has a webpage titled '<u>Photos and videos on your</u> <u>phone</u>' about the legalities of possessing or sharing photos and videos that the person in the photo may not be aware of. It is wise to be up to date on this subject.

Disability Strategy

A <u>new online hub</u> has been launched for parents and carers featuring information about the supports available for students with additional learning and support needs or disability. The online resource is designed for parent and carers to easily find up-to-date information about how to access support.

This resource will continue to be enhanced to meet identified needs. Creating a one-stop online resource with information for families and carers is a key commitment under the <u>Disability Strategy</u>.

Parent Line NSW – Free Counselling Service

Parent Line is a free telephone counselling service, that provides information and referral services for parents of children aged 0 to18 years who live in New South Wales. They also provide support and information for professionals working with families. Parent Line counsellors are available to help with any of your parenting issues.

For example, their counsellors can help with problems relating to young babies and children:

- Settling and feeding newborns and babies;
- Toddler taming;
- Managing child care and school transitions;
- Support during family separation;
- Managing stress and anxiety and
- Supporting your child after a traumatic event;
- Through to issues relating to teenagers including:
- Teen mental health;
- School and study issues;
- Managing technology use;
- Alcohol and drug use and
- Strategies to build positive relationships.

Planning for 2022

We have commenced our planning and organisation for 2022. If you know that your child/children won't be attending our school in 2022, with the exception of Year 6 students, could you please inform the office. Similarly, if you are aware of any students moving into our area who will be attending our school in 2022, please ask the families to make contact with the school. We need this information to form classes for next year. Also, if you are having an extended holiday and your child/children will not be back at school on the first day of 2022, please let us know in writing, before the end of the year.

Level 3 Restrictions

As of Monday 8 November, all staff and adult visitors must be fully vaccinated and provide proof of vaccination before entry on site is permitted. We are asking parents to not enter school grounds and to kiss and drop the children off outside the school gate. The same applies at pick up time. We are still operating under level 3 restrictions which means that parents are not allowed on site, with the exception of canteen volunteers, parents purchasing school uniforms or supporting curriculum implementation, as well as those involved in complex wellbeing matters.
