# trumental School Band Prog



Learning to play an instrument stimulates the brain cells, improving functions like memory and abstract reasoning skills, which are essential for Maths and Science. Music, in general, helps bring balance and harmony in one's life. Children who learn to play an instrument have an outlet for creativity and their emotions.'

Our school, in partnership with the Northern Rivers Conservatorium (NRC), organises a highly successful Band Program. The program provides Year 3 to Year 6 students with individual music tuition with a team of highly gualified teachers from the Northern Rivers Conservatorium Music in Schools Program.

Students have the opportunity to learn to play violin, viola, cello, flute, clarinet, trumpet, trombone, saxophone, percussion or bass guitar during their time at school. As well, all students in the program participate in weekly rehearsals with one of the bands or string ensembles to improve their performance skills. Throughout the year, students have many opportunities to perform at school assemblies, school extravaganzas, open performance days at the NRC, eisteddfods, band recitals at the Byron Theatre and even busking in the streets of Byron. The performances are planned to boost students' confidence and motivate them to commit to regular practice.

Many of the students continue their interest in music through high school and beyond, some students have performed with James Morrison and Sean O'Boyle. Parents have opportunities to be involved with the program as band managers and committee members, when health advice allows. The Band Program and NRC Music in Schools Program is an

extremely successful initiative that adds value to the educational opportunities provided at Byron Bay Public School. Geoff Spargo Band Manager

Communicating With Our Valued Community

- It is recommended that primary school aged children should only use Facebook Messenger for Kids so that parents can control what is going on in any group chats through the parental controls.
- Devices should never 'go to sleep' with students. Normalise handing them over to you before bedtime or to put them in another room until the next day so they are unable to respond to messages at crazy times of the night and morning.
- Help your child/ren develop the skills to leave a group chat that is not helpful or is harmful in any way. Teach them simple phrases to remove themselves from toxic conversations 'Sorry guys, I'm not feeling comfortable talking about that' or 'This is getting a bit nasty for me, I'm going to go'.
- Remind children that they must always be kind, respectful and responsible at all times while engaging in a group chat. All it takes is for someone to take a screengrab of cyberbullying for interactions to become public and be used as evidence against them.

Over the last 18 months the NSW Teachers Federation have exhausted all options to reach an agreement with the NSW state government over unsustainable workloads and uncompetitive salaries. #### **Level 3 Restrictions**

As of Monday 8 November, all staff and adult visitors must be fully vaccinated and provide proof of vaccination before entry on site is permitted. We are asking parents to not enter school grounds and to kiss and drop the children off outside the school gate. The same applies at pick up time. We are still operating under level 3 restrictions which means that parents are not allowed on site, with the exception of canteen volunteers, parents purchasing school uniforms or supporting curriculum implementation, as well as those involved in complex wellbeing matters.
