#### Attendance

Thank you to the large number of parents who already provide explanations for their child's absences. In accordance with the NSW Department of Education's policy and guidelines, all student absences need to be explained. The most effective way to inform us of the reason your child is away is to send a message through Schoolstream. Other ways you can notify us is through email, a written note to your child's teacher or a telephone call to the front office. If your child is away and we have not received an explanation, they are marked as having an unexplained and unjustified absence. Once we have received an explanation, this is updated on our school rolls. If your child returns to school after an absence and we have not received an explanation, an Explanation of Student Absence form will be sent home. Please complete the form and return it to your child's teacher the next day.
